## Ballplayer shows off wares at opening ceremonies

One of the most unique aspects of opening ceremonies at Mountain Ridge Little League is that it gives players a chance to get creative—designing products to sell and earn a little money.

Carlos Guerrero, 11, a member of the Triple-A Dodgers, embraced the baseball theme by creating necklace holders shaped like home plate. The project also gave Carlos an opportunity to bond with his father, Luis, who helped him build the pieces.

“I was thinking, ‘What could we make that would be something unique?’” Carlos said. “So I came up with this.”

In addition to holding necklaces, the design includes space to display a game ball, medals and other items. Carlos and Luis worked together to cut, assemble and paint the wood pieces. In keeping with his Dodgers

team, they were finished in Dodger blue—despite Luis and his wife, Michelle, both being Padres fans.

By the end of the opening ceremonies—which featured several other young entrepreneurs, along with booths from league sponsors—Carlos had sold three necklace holders, along with various necklaces and other jewelry.

“We did it all together,” said Carlos, a fifth grader at Bilbray Elementary School. “It was fun.”

This is his second year in the league, where he plays outfield and third base.

“He’s got a good swing—lots of power,” Michelle said.

The Guerreros live in Skye Canyon, and Michelle said one of the things they like most about the area is its strong sense of community.

“We know all our neighbors,” she said. “We know everybody around us.”

## Turning uncertainty into support: The story behind Vegas Kids Zone

Before Vegas Kids Zone, before the events and the magazine and the community we've built, I was working at home, nurturing our twin's preschool education.

While my son excelled at reading, he struggled with talking, noises, unexpected changes to our itinerary.

I knew something was different. Not wrong, just...different.

Did he have autism? He giggled, played games with his twin sister, ran straight at us for big hugs after preschool.

But I knew. Maybe.

I joined mom groups, started asking questions. And that's when it really hits you: every child is different. There is no one-size-fits-all plan.

The parents I began to lean on for more info had a saying: "If you met one child with autism, you've met one child with autism."

I realized we really had to dig deep, into our family and into what was available that wouldn't waste everyone's time. A mix of services, support, patience, and, most importantly, people who truly

understand.

Getting from that quiet knowing to an actual diagnosis felt like running in circles. Appointments, referrals, waiting, more waiting... and then finally, answers that somehow came with even more questions.

Okay, now what?

That was the hardest part.

Because once you have a diagnosis, you think the path will be clear, but instead, you're handed a list. A long one.

ABA providers with waitlists. Therapies you've never heard of. Recommendations that work beautifully for one child and not at all for another.

That experience is a big part of why I started Vegas Kids Zone.

I wanted to connect families with resources I wish I had known about back then, a place where families could find real options, real recommendations, and real connections.

Not just a directory, but a starting point. A shortcut through the noise.

Because what matters most isn't just the services, it's the village.

Building that village can feel really hard when you're in the middle of it.

So for this April Autism Awareness Issue of Vegas Family Insider,

# Kyle Canyon battery project: No longer charging ahead

The utility-scale lithium-ion battery storage project planned near the Kyle Canyon Road–Interstate 11 interchange has yet to file required land-use applications, according to the City of Las Vegas.

The 400-megawatt Aoki Energy Center, proposed by Clearway Energy Group, drew attention last year when the developer announced plans for the facility near an existing electrical substation.

But city officials say the project has not yet entered the formal approval pipeline.

“This item is not currently on an agenda for action,” a city spokesman said. “Aoki has not submitted an application.”

The project would require amendments to the city’s General Plan, and such amendments are only heard quarterly by the Las Vegas Planning Commission. That makes July 14 the earliest potential hearing date.

Clearway Energy said development work is continuing under a revised schedule.

“Though the timeline has shifted from our initial estimates, the project team looks forward to continuing work with community leadership and supporting local organizations as the permitting process unfolds,” a Clearway spokeswoman said.

The proposed facility would store electricity and release it back to the grid during periods of high demand.

Clearway said updates on the project will be posted at [aokienergy.com](http://aokienergy.com).

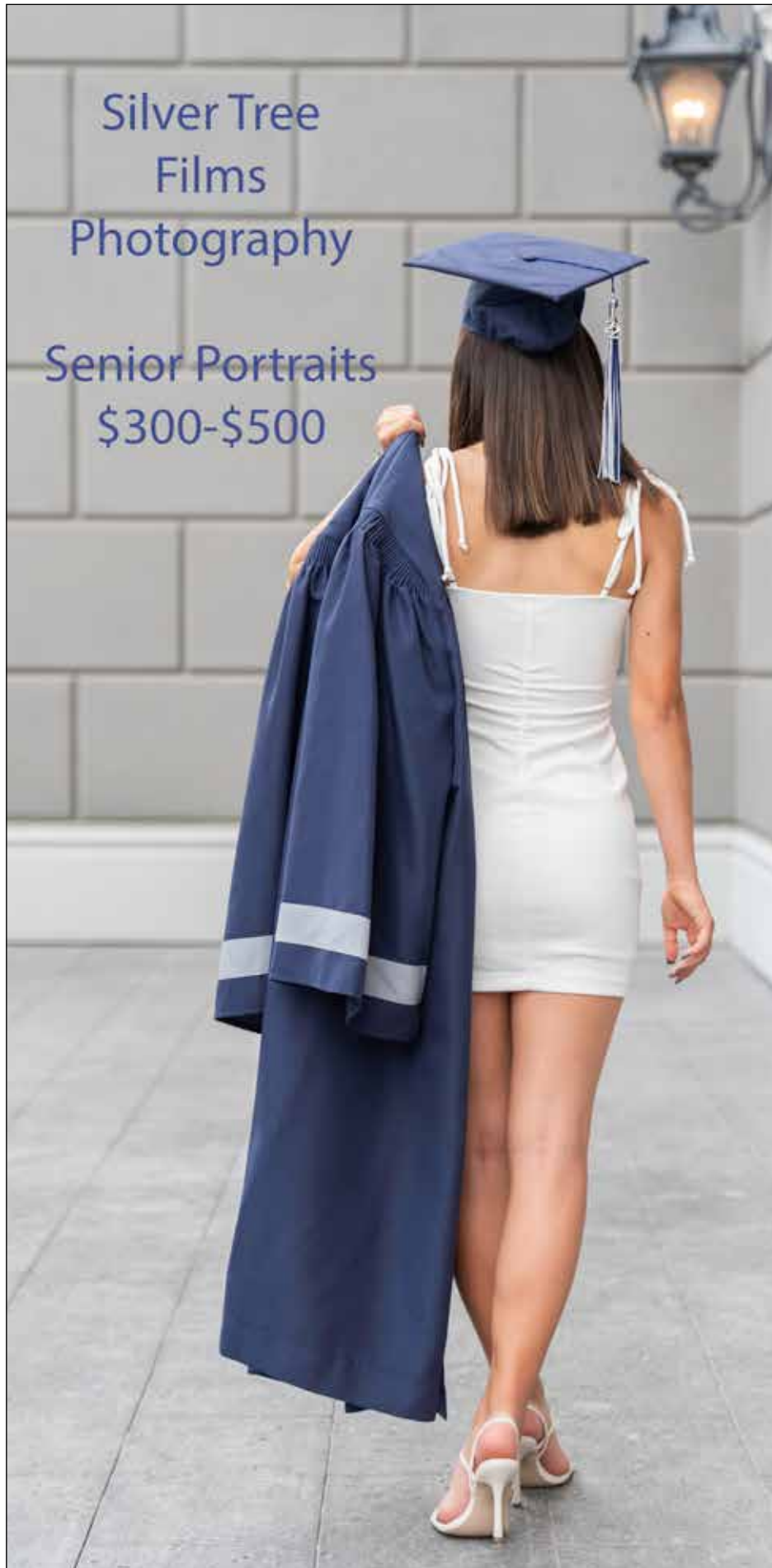

## WHY DO CHILDREN ASK FOR THE SAME BOOKS TO BE READ OVER AND OVER AGAIN?

The answer is similar to the reason that we as adults watch re-runs of TV shows, or read the same books over and over again: Predictability and Emotional Regulation. 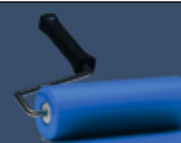

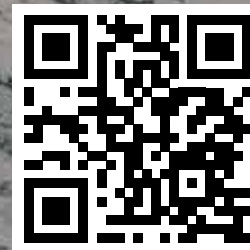
